

Hawker Audax

The Hawker Audax was a british two-seat I.bomber aircraft of the RAF. It was designed during the 1920s by Sydney Camm and manufactured by Hawker Aircraft.


The RAF used the H. Hart in both its original IL. Bomber role and as armament deleted. In additition, the Hart was used in a number roles, with variants for communication, operation in India and tropical


regions.

The Hart was an outstanding design, which gave rise to many variants. Developments included the Demon, Audax, Osprey, Hind, Hardy, Hartbees, Hector, Fury and Nimrod. Beyond Britain, the Hart would be operated by a number of foreign nations, including Afganistan, Canada, Egypt, Estonia, Persia, S.Africa...


Total production of H.Hart - 1004 aircraft.


