

National insignia is carried above left and below right wing. Codes are carried below left and above right wing.

Fuselage markings on right side.

A P-47D of the 104th FS, Maryland Air National Guard, 1946. The aircraft is overall dull natural metal with an Olive Drab anti-glare panel which extends onto the rear decking and and fin fillet. The windscreen frame is black but canopy frame is unpainted. In keeping with the time period, this aircraft wears the pre-January 1947 national insignia.

Note: This aircraft has the dorsal fin fillet.
